#### Carbonnade A La Flamande Dinner

The Center will be hosting a Carbonnade a la Flamande dinner on March 22<sup>nd</sup>. This variation of the traditional Flemish beef stew cooked in beer is made from a recipe handed down by Evelyn VanPuyvelde:

3lbs lean beef (chuck or roast) 1/4 c. shortening 1 ½ lb. Onion, thickly sliced salt, to taste pepper, to taste

1 can beer (light or non-alcoholic) 1 c. water

2-3 T. flour

2 beef bullion cubes 2 T. brown sugar 1 bay leaf pinch oregano (optional) pinch rosemary (optional) pinch basil (optional) 1 T. lemon juice 3-5 lb. potatoes

Cut meat into 1" pieces. Heat shortening and brown meat quickly. Remove meat; add onion to pan and cook until tender but not brown. Remove onions and add flour to the pan and stir. Add beer, water and bouillon cubes and cook until smooth. Add meat, onions and remaining ingredients except lemon juice. Cover and cook over a low heat for two hours or until meat is tender. Add lemon juice and serve hot over boiled potatoes.
