Alida Poma, 100, formerly of Rock Island, died Sunday, April 15, 2001 at the Marion County Nursing Home in Bull Shoals, Arkansas. She was born in Pittem, Belgium and married Joseph Poma in 1921. Shortly after the marriage, they moved to the United States, settling in Rock Island, IL. Joseph died in 1981. Alida was a charter member of the Belgian Bobbin Lacemakeers in Moline. A son and daughter-in-law, Albert A. and Minnie Poma, one grandson, two great grandsons and three great-great grandsons survive her.

Margaret Wancket, 87, died April 16, 2001. She was born June 17, 1913 and married Victor Wancket in 1933. He died in Feb. of 2001. A longtime board member for the Center for Belgian Culture in Olde Towne and the Olde Towne business Association, Dolores Bultinck, owner or The Flemish Lion, was among 218 women in Illinois last month to receive "Woman of Achievement" awards form Lt. Gov. Corinne Wood. Moline Mayor Stan Leach nominated her for the honor. "She's been very dedicated to this area," the mayor said recently. "She was one heck of a good college teacher. She's just been so much a part of the community." Dolores is also a past president of the Belgian Center. The daughter of poor Belgian immigrants from

West Flanders, Dolores was the first in her family to complete college, a B.A in commercial teaching from the University of Illinois, and a Ph.D in higher technical education from the University of Iowa. In 1973, she became the first female honorary consul of Belgium in the United States, a post she still holds. She has been decorated by the Belgian government, and has received the medal of merit from King Albert II.

Traveling to Belgium this summer? The Flanders Festival International will be held from June to November. Limburg presents Monteverdi's "Vespers" on June 1, and on June 9 the Paco Pena Group and Choir offer "Miss Flamenca" by Pena. On June 12, Handel's Messiah" is heard in Sint Truiden, and on June 26, Emma Kirkby joins the London Baroque Ensemble in a program of Handel Cantatas. The Netherlands Chamber Chorus performs Rachmaninoff's "All-Night Vigil" on June 29, and on July 3, the Hanoveer Band with Richard Egarr, organist, and Lynne Dawson soprano, perform motets and organ concertos by Handel. Gustav Leonhardt brings harpsichord music from the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centruries to Brugges on Aug. 7, and the Oslo Vocal Ensemble performs the Bach Magnificat on Aug. 10. A mass written in 1503 in Vienna by the Flemish composer Heinrich Isaac is performed by Hilliard Ensemble in Antwerp on Aug. 25, and on Aug. 27, the group presents the mass "De Beata Virgine" by the Flemish composer Josquin des Prez. ### Belgian "Tidbits"

- 1. With 800 foreign correspondents, Brussels can boast of the world's largest press communities, second only to Washington D.C.
- 2. According to statistics published by the German "Stastistischen Bundesambt", Belgium ranks 10<sup>th</sup> on the world list of the largest exporting countries. Considering its size, this is quite an achievement.

On January 1, Sweden took over the six-month, rotating presidency of the European Union. Sweden will pass the torch to Belgium on the 1<sup>st</sup> of July. Because Belgium is a member of the Eurogroup – the twelve countries that have adopted the euro as their common currency – and Sweden has not yet joined, Belgian Finance Minister Didier Reynders has already assumed the chair of the Eurogroup. Reynders will have the primary responsibility of overseeing the physical introduction of the euro in Belgium and of assuring the coordination of its debut in all 12 participating countries: Belgium, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, France, Germany, Italy, Spain, Portugal, Ireland, Austria, Finland and Greece. Owing to its strategic position halfway between the Mediterranean and northern Europe, Belgium – a naturally hospitable land – has become a magnet, a melting pot of cultures and a busy meeting place for artistic, cultural, economic, political and technological activity. As a founding member of the European Union, Belgium is fully tuned in to European issues. It is determined to deploy its considerable assets to ensure that its presidency of the Council of the European Union is once again a resounding success.
