BELGIAN BITS

"On April 12, the Bath-born 29-year-old Claire Coombs married Prince Laurent of Belgium, the youngest son of King Albert II and Queen Paola at the Brussels Town Hall. Large crowds gathered under a splendid sun outside the Town Hall to admire the royal bride dressed in white with a vintage veil of Brussels lace and carrying a trailing white bouquet. The Veil has been worn by three generations of royal brides, beginning with Queen Paola's grandmother Laura Mosselman du Chenoy in 1877. The subsequent religious ceremony, which took place at the Cathedral of Saints Michael and Gudula, was attended by 1500 guests among which were numerous European royalties."

On May 2nd and 3rd, the Belgian Embassy participated in Flower Mart, an annual springtime festival organized at the Washington National Cathedral. Belgium was the featured country at the fund raiser whose proceeds go towards the maintenance of the Cathedral's gardens and grounds. The 20,000+ visitors were impressed with the floral designs of Geert Pattyn, the traditional Belgian folk music performed by Paul Oorts and Karen Ashbrook, the lacemaking of the Chesapeake Region Lace Guild, and the 16th century period costumes worn by Belgian volunteers. In sum, this event was an excellent opportunity for the Belgian community to help the Washington Cathedral and reach out to the larger international community.
