# Flemish Spice Cookies

Serving Size: 10

1 Stick Unsalted Butter 3/4 Cup Dark Brown Sugar 1 Large Egg 1 Cup Flour 1/4 Cup Cake Flour 1/4 Teaspoon Salt 1 Teaspoon Baking Soda 1 Teaspoon Ground Cinnamon 1/2 Teaspoon Ground Ginger 1 Pinch Nutmeg

1 Pinch Ground Cloves

Beat the butter and sugar in mixing bowl with a wire whisk or mixer until light and fluffy about 5 minutes. Stir in egg. Sift the flours together with the remaining ingredients. Stir the flour mixture into the creamed butter. Stir into a smooth dough. Roll into a ball, wrap in plastic wrap and

refrigerate for 12 hours. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line 2 cookie sheets with aluminum foil and butter the foil generously. Roll out the dough 1/8 inch thick between 2 sheets of plastic wrap. If dough becomes sticky, put in freezer for a few minutes. Cut dough into 3X2 inch rectangles. Place them 1 inch apart on the cookie sheets. Bake until a golden brown, 10-12 minutes.

## Did you know......

- > Belgians are among the world's most avid newspaper readers just one way in which the country's 99% literacy rate manifests itself.
- Between the ages of two and a half and eighteen, children and young adults are able to attend school. An impressive part of Belgium's budget is devoted to a high quality education system extending from early childhood through university. The Belgian universities inherit a tradition that goes back to Charlemagne. Language learning is very widespread in Belgium. In fact, Belgium is undoubtedly the country with the highest number of bilingual or multilingual speakers per square mile, due to twelve years of compulsory education.
- > Belgian expertise enjoys such a reputation that its engineers are in demand the world over.

Since June 20 a Visitors centre for Brussels is open in the basement of the Saint Hubert Galleries: Brussels on Stage. It allows you to discover the great themes Brussels has to offer in a nice, interactive way. The visit ends in a Visitors room with an extensive selection of brochures on Brussels. Brussels International has produced 8 brochures especially for this room, each with a theme walk through Brussels, in 6 languages.

In September 2003, a Last Minute Ticketing service will be launched in the Visitors Centre at the initiative of the Foundation for the Arts, where, as the name announces, people can go for last minute tickets to countless concerts, theatre performances, etc.
