Our new Honorary Consul, Patrick Van Nevel, took the podium to share a few words about his reflections on the CBC. Rather than focus on the past, Patrick stressed that it was the volunteers of today who continue to make the CBC a thriving element of our community. It is the members that have kept it going for 40 years, and with dedication will continue for that and many more years to come. He made sure that no one's effort at the Center goes unnoticed. He made everyone in the room feel special by telling everyone a few words about each member there, and how they've helped the CBC. He mentioned not only the members present, but also those who couldn't be there to join the celebration. Patrick welcomed our new Consul General Philippe De Clerck to say a few words about Belgian foreign relations.

The Honorable Mr. De Clerck acquainted the membership with this topic by focusing on three of the most important facets of the Belgian Foreign diplomacy: the European Union, Africa, and North American bilateral relations.

The European Union continues to be a work in progress. Belgium, as one of the co-founding nations of the European Union, continues to play an important role in its further development as new Candidate Member States get ready to join the Union. Belgium continues to have strong ties with its former colonies in Central Africa. The civil wars, the political unrest and economic challenges continue to demand a lot of attention of the Belgian Foreign Affairs officials. North American bilateral relations have indeed come under a lot of pressure due to two main events: the Genocide Law and the war in Iraq. The Belgian government took steps to eliminate the abuse of the Genocide Law. The war in Iraq, opposed by many around the world and in the United States, demonstrates that friends can disagree, yet remain friends. The Belgian people remain very grateful to the American soldiers who liberated them. That liberty continues to exist today and allows the Belgian people to express their opinion as a free nation. Disagreement over the war in Iraq does not make our nations enemies - it allows for discussion, dialogue, understanding and appreciation for each other's opinions, goals and aspirations and eventually builds a stronger bond between nations.

We were also honored to have a few special guests. Sophie Poletto, a Rotary International Exchange Student, is currently attending Moline High School and enjoyed the evening with us. She is from the Charleroi region of Belgium and arrived in Moline this past August. Luc Fabry, with Flanders Investment and Trade, was also in attendance. Mr. Fabry is Director of Business Development for the Flanders Foreign Investment Office. Also joining us was a lovely young couple who just moved to the Quad Cities from Belgium this past month, Nicolas Gevaert and his wife Silvia. Nicolas is Division Controller of PB Leiner, which is a division of the Belgian Tessenderlo Chemie Group. He is from Oudenaarde and Silvia is from Deerlijk.
