News from Belgium

11th International Lace Biennial - Contemporary Art - Queen Fabiola Grand Prix. This event will contribute to the international image of Belgium.

Baron Paul Janssen, founder of the Belgium's Janssen Pharmaceutica, now part of Johnson & Johnson passed away last month. Drugs developed by Dr. Janssen and his company treat a wide range of disorders, including psychoses, chronic pain and fungal infections. Dr. Janssen and the company he founded hold numerous patents around the world and are credited for many breakthroughs in the medical field. This multinational company employs many specialists in different fields and has a large number of emigrants/expatriates. Janssen Pharmaceutica has approximately 55 to 60 Belgians working abroad while scientists from 34 different nationalities work at the research center in Beerse. We plan to provide more information on this outstanding Belgian scientist and humanitarian at a later date.

Belgian athletes close out a terrific year: Kim Clijsters and Justine Henin-Hardenne have occupied the #1 and #2 spot in the world rankings. Our small country also dominates the world of dirt bike racing. Everts, Smets and Ramon hold the world titles in the their respective classifications. Stefan Everts in particular seems unbeatable and has gained his seventh world title. After watching a race on TV a while back, I wondered if he has a doctor of chiropractic on staff...

During the November 9th mass in St Peter's Square, pope John Paul II beautified five European religious including Belgian Franciscan father Valentin Paquay, 1828-1905, a famed confessor; he was also an early leader in the movement to encourage the faithful to receive the Eucharist frequently.

On September 30 Nizar Trabelsi, a Tunesian national, and Tarek Marroufi, a Tunesian-born Belgian, were both sentenced in Brussels, the first for planning an attack against NATO base in Kleine Brogel and the second for providing stolen passports to the murderers of the Afghan Northern Alliance Leader Ahmed Shah Massoud. These convictions are recent examples of Belgium's commitment to the global fight against terrorism.

The new tamper-resistant Belgian passport is recognized as one of the most fail-sale travel documents in the world. Since its introduction in 2001, not a single one has been successfully forged. At its latest general assembly, held in Spain at the end of September, Interpol presented Belgium a "special reward" for the passport, acknowledging that it incorporates the latest technologies for preventing counterfeiting.

Belgium retains important seats at the International Monetary Fund and World Bank. For the next ten years, Belgium will continue to have a director's seat on the International Monetary Fund's Executive Board. The Executive board is responsible for conducting the day-to-day business of the IMF. It is composed of 24 directors. The five largest shareholders (France, Germany, Japan, the United Kingdom, and the United States) appoint an Executive Director, while other member countries are represented by 19 Executive Directors elected within constituencies.

If you are going to Belgium, have a heavy foot and plan to drive, be forewarned! Unmanned speed cameras are now a permanent feature of the traffic landscape. The effect they have is clearly impressive. Not only has traffic slowed down visibly, the results of accidents statistics also speak volumes. In some places the number of accidents fell by 40%!
