### Did you know.....

- ⇒ Belgium ranks near the top in "Quality of Life". According to the most recent United Nations Human Development Report, Belgium placed third in the European Union and sixth in the world on the quality of life index. The report considers such factors as health and life expectancy, education and earnings, to allow a broader view of a country's development than offered by income alone. Belgium was outranked by only Sweden and the Netherlands within the European Union. The United States occupies eighth place in the ranking. The Belgians have an average life expectancy of 78.7 years and an average per person GDP of \$27,570. But Belgium scores particularly high in the area of education: its combined primary, secondary and higher education enrollment ratio is the 4<sup>th</sup> highest in the world.
- ⇒ According to the cost-of-living survey of 144 world capitals, Brussels was ranked as one of the lowest cost major cities.
- ⇒ Brussels is ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> position (after Usuima in Finland and Stockholm in Sweden) out of 91 regions in competitiveness. The report was based on Creativity, Knowledge, Economy, Sectoral Productivity, Performance, Economic Performance and Infrastructure and Accessibility.
- ⇒ Linda Polich, one of our monthly lace makers and regular volunteer reported that Patrick Van Nevel provided an excellent program for the Friends of Rock Island County Historical Society luncheon on Monday, September 20, 2004, at the Deere-Wiman Carriage House in Moline. He spoke about the Center for Belgian Culture, his involvement as Honorary Consul of Belgium, and also about Belgium in general its culture, its economy, and its people. And he of course invited everyone to the next Waffle Breakfast at the Center! His program was very well received by the 35 attendees.
- ⇒ Olympic images and flags: Made in Belgium. Belgium won three medals at this summer's Olympic games in Athens: one gold medal for Justine Henin-Hardenne (tennis), and bronze medals for cyclist Axel Meckx, son of legendary Eddy Mercks, and Ilse Heylen (judo). Fifteen Belgian

athletes qualified for the finals, more than ever before. Belgium's presence was not limited to its athletes. Antwerp-based Alfacam was contracted to provide images for about a third of the Olympic events. Also, Mouscron-based Wollux delivered 65,000 Olympic flags to the International Olympic Organizing Committee. This marked the third game in a row that Wollux, one of the biggest flag-producing companies in the world, has supplied flags for the Olympic Games.

⇒ Championship of the United Bolders Clubs of Western Illinois was held September 12, 2004 at the Bolle courts in Stephens Park. The CBC was the host for the tournament. Bill Fisher coordinated the event and did a fantastic job representing the CBC. Thank you Bill! The CBC took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the tournament.
