

## "Battle of the Bulge" 60th Anniversary

December 16, 2004, will mark the 60th anniversary of the beginning of the Battle of the Bulge. The Battle of the Bulge, which lasted from December 16, 1944, to January 25, 1945, was the largest land battle of World War II in which the United States participated.

More than a million men fought in this battle including some 600,000 Germans, 500,000 Americans, and 55,000 British. The German military force consisted of two Armies with ten corps (equal to 29 divisions). While the American military force consisted of a total of three armies with six corps (equal to 31 divisions).

At the conclusion of the battle, the casualties were as follows: 81,000 U.S. with 19,000 killed; 1,400 British with 200 killed; and 100,000 Germans killed, wounded or captured.

# "Some 58 DISTANT YEARS AGO"

The hills of Bastogne were covered in snow. The Battle of the Bulge got its start As a battle of sacrifices which would never depart From the hearts and souls of the young men and women that fought The most famous of battles that taught us a lot.

> "There is nothing to report", "Don't give up," and "Nuts to you" these words would follow the soldiers through and through. Young Americans in foxholes take their command It is a lot to expect and much to demand.

Persevere, push on and conquer they did With lack of supplies and the conditions torrid. The wintry snows and fog would persevere Hungry and scared they continued with fear.

In the foxholes they waited for the bombardiers To attack the enemy and defend the Belgian frontier. Many left blood on the hills of Bastogne fighting to protect the freedom of their own. The Ardennes, Malmedy and St. Vith to name a few Were where the Allies finally flew.

> Mothers and fathers waited in the states For the news good or bad and learn of their son's or daughter's fate.

From December 16 in '44 To January 25 in '45 The soldiers fought on to stay alive The battle raged on while they held their positions The Allies determined to complete their mission.
