Sister Ruth spent many years in religious education assignments, worked in the Peoria Diocese Office of Education, was president of her community, and administered to the elderly at St. Joseph's Home in Springfield.

She also played a mean piano rendition of "Frosty the Snowman," accompanied by the

Coopman and Witte niece and nephew choir. She is a favorite with the Coopman clan in Belgium, as she was the only member of that large, extended family to enter religious life.

Sister Mary Esther Pavich was a cook and teacher throughout her ministry. She served assignments at 15 different locations, including two assignments to Sacred Heart School in Moline from 1949-56 and 1960-61.

On the first day of kindergarten, this editor did NOT want to go to school. I cried all the way
