How to Build Schools

The Flemish region will build 200 new schools between now and 2016, as part of a public-private investment initiative called Schools for Tomorrow. The majority of the funding (68%) will go to a network of mainly Catholic schools.

The project was described as a "catch-up operation" due to school infrastructure in Flanders ageing rapidly: three out of five buildings are more than 40 years old. This is the first time that so many schools will be built in such a short period of time. All will be sustainable, well-built, and suitable for the needs of today's students.

The private partners will pay for design, construction, and maintenance for a period of 30 years, during which they will charge the Flemish education authorities a fee. Ownership of the buildings reverts to the school authorities at the end of the 30 years.

Have It Your Way

Years ago, the advertising campaign for Burger King touted that you could order your hamburger "your way." Now travelers to Belgium can have their city guide their way as well. On the CityTripPlanner website, you have a choice of 16 cities, among them Antwerp, Bruges, Brussels, Ghent, Leuven, and Mechelen. Choose one, then set about making a city guide tailored to your needs – and no one elses.

On the website's menu of options, you apply stars – one to four – to different subjects. Perhaps you would want full-out shopping (four stars), attractions and activities, and streets and squares. With one click, the site provides a two-day guide with activities from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., with a detailed itinerary, a map, and notes on what one would find along the way. The times allotted to each attraction might not suite you, but even that can be customized. You can even scrap an element and recalculate the whole trip.

You can also get travel directions, buy a train ticket or book a hotel. CityTripPlanner has a free app for Android and iPhone users, but you have to pay 4 Euros to download or print your customized trip. But compare that to the price of a guidebook, and it all starts to look reasonable. The custom guides are available in English. Check www.cityplanner.com. (Thanks to Flanders Today)
