Belgium on a Plate



When it comes to food, Belgians tend to take certain things for granted: fresh bread is always just around the corner; the meats and cheeses are good enough to eat raw; and for \$4 or less, one can enjoy a sampling of the world's finest beers in any café. Many people of Belgium never thought their food as special.

In the world outside Belgium, that modesty often results in Belgian cuisine being reduced to chocolate, beer, and Brussels sprouts. A new English-language book, What's Cooking in Belgium: Recipes and Stories from a Food-Loving Nation attempts to remedy this situation by painting a portrait of the history and culture of Belgium through its food. The book was written by Anna Jenkinson and Neil Evans, British expatriates living in Brussels.

What's Cooking is not an exhaustive anthology, but rather, a carefully assembled collection of common Belgian delights. "It could be a cookbook and live in the kitchen," author Jenkinson says, "but it could be a coffee table book and live in the living room."

Accompanying the recipes are well-researched vignettes that place the dishes in their modern and historical context. Whether it's a description of the annual Golden Throwing of the Chicken Leg from the windows of Londerzeel's town hall or the fact that the average Belgian consumes 14 pounds of Belgian endive (chicory) each year, the book is filled with fascinating facts that round out the story of local food.

The authors went to some lengths to make sure the recipes are feasible for those not living in Belgium. When potentially hard-to-find ingredients are used, they provide suggestions for suitable alternatives.
