<u>My Belgian Heritage</u> by Mitchell Schneider

My great-grandfather Alberic VandeWiele was born in Ghent, Belgium, in 1899. When he was sixteen, he and a friend

made the trip by boat to America and landed at Ellis Island. Great-grandpa came to America for work and to earn money. He went on to Detroit, then to New Mexico, and later to East Moline, Illinois. He came to the Quad Cities because he had heard there were many Belgians living here and to work at John Deere.



In 1935, Alberic VandeWiele married Mary Martens, another Belgian. Alberic and Mary had three sons. My grandfather Robert Jean VandeWiele was born at Moline Public Hospital September 30, 1936. John VandeWiele was born November 11, 1937, and Jerry was born December 4, 1941.

My grandmother, Ruth Ann Donelson was born on October 12, 1938, in a house in LeClaire, Iowa. On December 31, 1955, Grandpa, at the age of 19, married Grandma, at the age of 17. They had three children, Mark, Nancy (my mom), and Sue.

On July 6, 1985, my mother married my father, Jeff. I was born August 24, 1994. and my brother Jared was born May 27, 1997. September 27, 2005, my parents divorced. In 1975, Great-grandpa had the opportunity to return to Belgium and visit his 10 brothers and sisters. Once he made the trip, two of his brothers came to visit him in America. Greatgrandpa did not speak English very well. It has been told it was a mixture of Flemish and English.

My mother was fortunate to visit Brussels when she was 16. She and her cousin Gregg made the trip to Belgium by themselves. They stayed with Great-grandpa's sister Irma. Irma did not speak English, and my mom did not speak Flemish. Somehow they communicated by pointing and using a translation book. My mom was also able to visit Holland and France. We still have Belgian lace and a windmill she brought back from her trip.

One of my mom's relatives from Belgium found her and started emailing. They now keep in touch using Facebook. Chris VandeWiele is her name and the two of them are trying to put together a family tree. It is nice to know there is still family over there and we can communicate. I love hearing about my heritage. Just knowing that my family has history in Belgium is great because I still have a whole different world to visit. We do not talk a lot about our heritage but after getting to know some information about my Great-grandpa it makes me want to learn more.

My heritage started in Belgium and now continues in America. My dream is to someday visit Belgium and visit where my ancestors started. All the great stories my mom has told me from her trip only makes me want to visit myself to experience all the beauty Belgium has to offer. Everyone tells me when they go to Europe that Belgium is an amazing place to visit, and they have really good waffles too.
