Honors for the Poet

Loen Verlaeckt, secretary-general of the Flanders Dep't. of Foreign Affairs, traveled to Ottawa, Canada, for the May 3rd unveiling of a statue in honor of the Canadian doctor and soldier John McCrae.

McCrae served in the trenches near Ypres during the First World War and composed the famous poem "In Flanders Fields" while tending soldiers at Essex Farm in May 1915. McCrae dedicated the poem to his friend Alex Helmer, who was killed by an exploding grenade during a German gas attack. The poem refers to poppies, which led to the red flower being adopted worldwide as a symbol of remembrance.

"The horrors of the First World War on the western front are forever linked to the landscape of Flanders Fields because of the poem by John McCrae," said Verlaeckt. "It is our duty to keep this memory alive and pass it on to future generations."

The larger-than-life bronze memorial, which shows a sitting McCrae, notebook in hand, is supported by the government of Flanders. It sits in front of the National Artillery Memorial, just east of downtown Ottawa. A duplicate of the statue is being unveiled later this year in McCrae's hometown of Guelph, Ontario, about 300 miles southwest of Ottawa.

Biscuits for Cigars

The West Flanders bakery company Jules Destrooper, famous for its butter waffles, has been taken over by GT&CO, a holding company of the Vandermarliere family, best known as a cigar manufacturer.

Jules Destrooper first brought his waffles to market in 1890 and has since grown into one of the country's most recognizable brands, with sales in 75 countries. Last year, the company had total sales of \$40.3 million.

Belgian Beer Conglomerate?

Leuven-based InBev, the world's largest brewing group, is reported by the Wall Street Journal to be in talks with its banks with a view to preparing a takeover bid for SABMiller, it largest London-based competitor. The bid is said to be worth approximately \$105 billion, the largest the beer industry has seen since the takeover of Anheuser-Busch by InBev in 2008.

SABMiller – which stands for South African Breweries – was established to meet the beer needs of South African miners at the end of the 19th century, and moved its bases to London in 1999, before taking over Miller Brewing of Milwaukee in 2002. It has operations worldwide and owns several brands including Fosters, Grolsch, and Carling Black Label. It is also a major bottler of Coca-Cola.

A takeover by InBev would make its position as the world's largest brewery unassailable and give it new market possibilities in Africa, China, and Australia. InBev brands include Jupiler, Stella Artois, and Hoegaarden in Belgium, and Budweiser and Corona in the US.
