Oh, Rats!

Throughout the world, places that have been involved in war and/or civil strife often have large minefields that still need clearing. In 2013, it was estimated that there was a global average of around nine mine-related deaths every day.

Bart Weetjens loved playing with his pet rodents when he was but a lad. Years later, as a student at the University of Antwerp, Bart applied the idea of using rodents for mine detection. He knew that rats, with their strong sense of smell and trainability, could provide a cheaper, more efficient and locally available means to detect landmines. Early research began in Belgium with financial support from the Belgian Directorate for International Co-operation.

Known today as APOPO, (which in English basically stands for Anti-Personnel Landmine Detection), it has developed a way to train African pouched rats (named for the storage pouch in their cheeks) to sniff out bombs quickly and safely. This rat is used because it has an incredible sense of smell and a long lifespan to yield results on the nine months of training these rats undergo.

The average mine requires roughly 11 pounds of weight to trigger an explosion. Even the biggest of the pouched rats are only around 3 pounds. They're trained to sniff out only explosives, so they aren't distracted by other metal objects the way minesweepers are. They can effectively search 200 square meters in less than 20 minutes.

After 4-5 years on the job – or whenever they lose interest in working – they're allowed to retire to a life of dining on various fruits, nuts, and other healthy treats. And in case you're wondering, no rat has lost its life due to detonation since the program started in 1997.
