Our first scholarship honoree is Kelli Kluever of Annawan, Illinois. Kelli was a member of the National Honor Society, a soloist at the IHSA Solo Ensemble (with a perfect score), an Illinois State Scholar, president of the student council, and a drum major in the band. She will be attending St. Ambrose University and majoring in nursing.

MY HERITAGE by Kelli Kluever

It is common knowledge that many Europeans came over to America as early as the 1600s, but the most fascinating part is their origin and the ancestors who came after them. For me personally, both sets of my great-great grandparents and my great grandfather on my mother's VanDeVoorde side came over on a boat from Belgium in the late 1800s to early 1900s. Their courage and willingness to sacrifice so much to start a new life in America contributes greatly to my own success, because it is likely that I would not be here without them. To understand my heritage, it is important to understand where I came from, the customs of my ancestors' country, and my own personal family stories and experiences.

Belgium is a relatively mid-sized country, about the size of the Maryland, stuck between France, Germany, Luxembourg, and the Netherlands. Most, to all, of my family on my mother's side came from this region, along with most of the ancestors of the people in my town. I live in an area now that is densely populated with Belgian descendants, and I find it interesting that we all have a similar heritage. I think it is important for everyone, including myself, to appreciate the opportunities we are given because our ancestors were so brave.

It is important to know the customs of my ancestors in order to preserve their memory and keep the culture of the family name alive. On the surface, I know that Belgians are strong Roman Catholics, and they enjoy playing rolle bolle, still a popular activity in my town. As I investigated further, I found that Belgians also strongly respect family, pay close attention to appearance and cleanliness, and the being punctual signifies respect. I realized that I live these customs in my everyday life and hardly noticed how I practice my ancestors' customs.

Rolle bolle is an important sport to the Belgian culture. Each year, my community holds the rolle bolle world tournament, in which many players from nearby towns and states come together to compete. I find it incredible that a sport, so important to my ancestors, can continue to live on many years after they immigrated to America. I think it is fascinating to learn the sport and see it played here.

My family has always taken its Belgian culture seriously. My grandmother can still speak some words in the Belgian language, despite living in America her entire life. She will also make hutsepot for the meal. My great uncle Hubert VanDeVoorde was an active member of the Belgian Culture Center for many years. My great aunt Diane, who is now a
