MY HERITAGE by Sage Roberson

Robbie Robertson, a well-known musician, once stated this on the importance of heritage: "You don't stumble upon your heritage. It's there, just waiting to be explored and shared." When I was younger, I did not know the exact importance of heritage, but as I matured and was able to understand more, I soon found out.



When I was nine years old, my mom and I lived upstairs from the Center for Belgian Culture. We would always smell waffles cooking on the first Saturday of every month, and we decided to go try them out. This changed my whole perception of the importance of my heritage. Everyone has their own story about their family's heritage, which is why my heritage is important. Being knowledgeable of your family and how you came about is essential. Both of my grandparents are Belgian, but my great grandfather's journey to America was truly eye-opening.

Andy Jennes was born in Belgium and like many others living in Europe at that time, heard about the American dream. He saved all the money he could in order to sail to America in search of prosperity and a better life. It was not easy at first. Working hard and saving, he purchased some land and became a successful farmer. It was during this time that he formed a family and together they lived a good life.

The great thing about heritage in general is that everyone has their own family story. Most of my family is Belgian and I have a firm understanding of the family's journey. Yet there is still a lot out there waiting to be discovered. My mom and I have spent a great amount of time on websites learning about our family tree and how the family formed. We both became interested because there is much more to the family than first thought.

All in all, I have come a long way from my first encounter with family heritage. Yes, there are some who simply do not care about their background. I would advise these people to educate themselves, as there are many resources available to anyone searching for family information.

Being Belgian has been life-changing for me. I have been accepted by the Belgians and the community, and I love seeing the smiles when serving the customers who come to the waffle breakfasts. Memories like these will continue to grow and will last a lifetime.
