APPLICATION FOR RUTH LAMBRICK VANTIEGHEM SCHOLAR AWARD

The Ruth Lambrick VanTieghem scholarship is offered in memory of Ruth Lambrick VanTieghem. Ruth was a loving wife and devoted mother and grandmother. She valued family and knew the importance of a good education. The purpose of the award is to recognize and encourage a deserving student who has completed at least two years of college and plans to continue his/her education. This \$1200 award may be used for college expenses.

To qualify for the award, the applicant must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1. Student must have successfully completed at least two years of college and plan to continue their education.
- 2. Student must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 based on a 4.0 system.
- 3. Submission of a letter of recommendation from someone (non-relative) who knows the applicant as a student, an employee, or a volunteer i.e. someone who can provide insight into the applicant's personal character, potential and motivation.
- 4. Complete the attached application form.
- 5. On a separate piece of paper, attach a 500 to 1,000-word essay on your heritage.

An award committee will select the candidate for the award. The committee must receive applications by April 15, 2024. Only complete application packets will be considered by the committee. The award will be awarded at The Center for Belgian Culture Annual Meeting. The Center reserves the right to promote this award in their publications and with the local media.
